## **HYDRANT FLUSHING**

The Walcott Public Works Department will continue to flush hydrants during the month of June. Customers may notice decreased water pressure or discoloration of water. This is a temporary situation resulting from flushing sediment out of the pipes. Should you experience cloudy or discolored water, shut the water off and wait several minutes then run the cold water for a few minutes for the water to clear up. We appreciate your understanding and patience during this maintenance activity.

## FIREWORKS USE PROHIBITED IN WALCOTT

The State of Iowa now allows sales of fireworks, during limited dates, by sellers that have obtained a permit from the State Fire Marshall but the use of fireworks may still be prohibited or regulated by each City. Please note that the City of Walcott's current ordinance prohibits the use of fireworks, except for fireworks displays, by a competent operator that has obtained a permit by the City.

## OPEN BURNING PROHIBITED

Only recreational fires are allowed in Walcott city limits. Recreational fires must be in a permanent or portable outdoor fireplace designed for cooking or recreational burning and only natural wood or charcoal may be burned.

## BE A RESPONSIBLE PET OWNER

When walking your dog in Walcott, remember that it must be leashed when it is off of your property, which includes the sidewalk and boulevard in front of your home.

As a reminder, pets are not allowed in the Walcott parks with the exception of the Recreational Trail at Prairie View Park. While visiting Prairie View Park pets must remain on a leash.

Please remember that it is important to immediately clean up any pet waste in public areas. Take along a baggie with you to pick up waste and then dispose of it properly. By taking a few simple steps to clean up after your pet, you can contribute to the enjoyment of our community by everyone.

## **NEWS FROM CALVARY**

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:34-35, NIV)
This is the core bit of scripture around which I will, with help from the Holy Spirit, craft the sermon for Sunday, the 19th of May. As you read this, that date has probably passed, but as I write this, it remains a thing on my To Do List. The thing that is leading me to my next sermon was something that came out in my last sermon. It's not something terribly original, nor terribly creative, but it sang to my heart as the Spirit whispered it to me, and it hasn't let me go yet. Which usually means I need to say more about it.

The scripture passage that inspired me last week was this:

The crowd around Jesus had demanded that he tell them plainly if he was the Messiah. And he said, "I did tell you, but you don't believe. The works I do in my Father's name testify about me, 26 but you don't believe because you are not my sheep. 27 My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me." (John 10:25-27)

And I made the point that it's not enough to be RIGHT ... it's not enough to DO ... right. These THINGS ARE IMPORTANT ... but in the END ... being KNOWN ... is the currency that matters. And this has informed my reading of the text for this week. It promises that if we will just love one another, THAT EVERYONE WILL KNOW WE ARE JESUS' DISCIPLES, but there is an implied warning as well. It warns THAT WE, All of us, will be known, disciples or NOT. We will be known by God, but also by our friends, by our families, by the people with whom we work, and play, and live. In the end, they will know us. We can choose to let something other than love guide our lives. Frankly, this is a real temptation at times, because love is the harder choice. Love REQUIRES MORE FROM US, MORE TIME, MORE ENERGY. Love is demanding. It's often painful and so, takes MORE COURAGE, AND IT REQUIRES THAT OUR COURAGE

grow as our capacity to love grows. Do you know why it's so costly? Because it's worth it. Because in the end, everyone will know how much we loved them. In the end, I want my life to be a crumpled, smoking, heap of exhaustion, because I spent every bit of it, on love.

## MINI CHEESECAKE TRIFLE

Yield: 6-7 Mini Desserts, or 4-5 moderate sized desserts. This fluffy, cheesecake dessert is simple to prepare, and is delicious accompanied by fresh berries.

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

#### Graham Cracker Crumble

1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs (about 10 full sized crackers)

1/3 cup butter, melted

I tablespoon sugar

#### Fluffy Cheesecake

- I 8oz block cream cheese
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice 2 tablespoons milk (any fat content)
- 2 cups cool whip, or freshly whipped cream

Fresh berries (strawberries and blueberries shown)

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

#### Graham Cracker Crumble

Crush crackers in a large ziplock type bag. Pour crumbs, sugar and melted butter into a bowl and stir until fully combined. Pour into a 9-1/2×13-1/2

casserole dish and press into a even layer. Bake at 350°F for 10-12 minutes, until light brown. Allow to cool.

#### Fluffy Cheesecake

I. Beat cream cheese in the bowl of an electric mixer until smooth. Add powdered sugar, beat to combine. Add lemon juice and beat until fully incorporated. Add milk, and combine.

2. Fold cool whip or freshly whipped cream into cream cheese mixture. Spoon into dessert dishes, or for smaller dishes, fill a large piping bag and pipe into dessert dishes.

#### **Dessert Assembly**

To create the dessert as shown, layer a spoonful of graham cracker crumble, then a layer of cheesecake, fresh chopped strawberries, more cheesecake, fresh blueberries, and a final layer of cheesecake.

Note - Using the proportions listed above, you will likely end up with extra graham cracker crumble. Store the remaining crumble in an airtight container up to a month.


