NEWS FROM CALVARY

John 19: 18 There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus between them.

1Tim 2: 5-6 For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human, who gave himself a ransom for all-this was attested at the right time.

Rev 5: 6 Then I saw between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders a Lamb standing as if it had been slaughtered, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth.

The Romans, in ancient times, worshiped a god named Janus. Janus was the god of beginnings and endings, and so, also the god of transitions. One would find Janus Honored at gates, doors, and passages but also at certain times. The Julian calendar begins – and so also ends with January, honoring Janus, the god of the transition between an end and a beginning.

I'm not advocating for an ancient Roman belief. I'm simply pointing out that the ancient Romans perceived something, imperfectly, at work in the in-between places. What they perceived, imperfectly, was our very own Jesus, who has always stood between one person and another, between God and humanity, and between heaven and earth. So, we are never alone, never with-



out that holy power, even when we find ourselves inbetween a rock and a hard place.

Many are finding themselves right in the middle of that uncomfortable place, in between how things have been, and where things seem to be going. Every week seems to reveal some new technological wonder or nightmare, depending on your perspective. In the past year we have seen no end of upsets and surprises, and it doesn't seem to matter if we're talking locally, denominationally, or globally. Next year will bring new elections, another emotionally laden General Conference, and, we can assume, even more upsets and surprises on the international scene. Why would this year be different?

As we make our way, however, striving to find a path from where we have been to where we want to be, let's try to stay open to trying new things, new strategies, new tools, while maintaining the values that define us as a people. Our practices, strategies and tools are developed over time from our values, from who we are. Our values are not produced from our practices.

Many are feeling some anxiety right now with everything that's going on in our world, but as I said, right now, as we stand in between where we've been and the future we want to live in, this is the perfect time to remember that we are surrounded by Great Power! The same Jesus who has walked every step with us so far is right here, where we stand in this present moment. Have faith, something awesome is just beginning!


