After more than five years of planning, fundraising, and constructing, Walcott residents and visitors can now enjoy the new Splash Pad across from Wescott Park. A ribbon cutting was held on August 7th to officially open the Splash Pad. The City is excited to provide this new summer recreational facility for local families to enjoy for years to come!

The Splash Pad Project was identified as a top recreational priority for both adults and youth during a public meeting with a team of consultants with the lowa Economic Development Authority in 2012. The City moved forward with the project in late 2013 by purchasing two lots adjacent to the tennis courts from siblings, Carol Snay, Nancy Engler, and Delbert "Bing" Lamp. A Splash Pad Committee was established in February, 2014, to research, design, and fundraise for the project.

The cost of the Splash Pad project was approximately \$217,000. This includes the construction, splash pad equipment, equipment building, and amenities. The shelter is being generously donated and built by the Hearts and Hands Foundation and the Mickey Burt Family/Burt Clinic. The project fund began with a park memorial, in the amount of \$28,876, from the late lone Paustian and the City contributed an additional \$83,300. City staff wrote and received grants from the Scott County Regional Authority, totaling \$48,800, and the Roy J. Carver Charitable Trust, in the amount of \$15,000. Fundraising activities totaled \$41,024, including donations from local organ-

zations, businesses, and private individuals with large contributions received from Walcott Day Committee - \$7,500 and Walcott Trust & Savings Bank - \$5,000.

The City of Walcott would like to thank everyone for their generous financial contributions and support for this project on its way to completion! A special thanks to city staff and the Park Board and Splash Pad Committee members for their time and efforts in steering this project!

The Splash Pad is currently open on a daily basis until dusk, weather permitting. How does it work? The area is equipped with a sensor (on the north side of the concrete) which is activated by stepping on it. When the sensor is stepped on, the Splash Pad turns on. Then, after a set period of time, the Splash Pad will automatically shut off and remain off, unless it is activated again by another tap on the sensor.





HARVEST CHICKEN CASSEROLE

Yields: 6-8 servings | Prep time: 20 min. | Total time: 1 hour **INGREDIENTS**

3 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, divided, plus more for baking dish

2 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts

Kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper

1/2 onion, chopped

2 medium sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into small cubes

1 lb. brussels sprouts, trimmed and quartered

2 garlic cloves, minced

2 tsp. fresh thyme leaves

1 tsp. paprika

1/2 tsp. cumin

1/2 c. chicken broth, divided

6 c. cooked wild rice

1/2 c. dried cranberries

1/2 c. sliced almonds

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350° and grease a 9"-x-13" baking dish with oil. In a large, deep skillet over medium-high heat, heat 1 tablespoon oil. Season chicken with salt and pepper. Add chicken to skillet and cook until golden and cooked through, 8 minutes per side. Let rest 10 minutes, then cut into 1" pieces.

2. Heat another tablespoon oil over medium heat. Add onion, sweet potatoes, Brussels sprouts, garlic, thyme, paprika and cumin. Season with salt and pepper and cook until softened, 5 minutes. Add 1/4 cup broth, bring to a simmer, and cook, covered, 5 minutes.
