The Walcott City Council is accepting applications for a vacancy on the Planning & Zoning Commission, Parks and Recreation Board, and Zoning Board of Adjustment. Applications can be found at [www.cityofwalcott.com](http://www.cityofwalcott.com) or at Walcott City Hall.

The Planning & Zoning Commission meets as needed on the second Monday of each month at 6:00 p.m. The Commission reviews and makes recommendations to the City Council on matters regarding zoning, planning, and development. The Parks and Recreation Board typically meet as needed on the first Wednesday of each month at 5:15 p.m. The Board advises the City Council on the needed facilities to provide open space such as parks, playgrounds, and community recreational programs. The Zoning Board of Adjustment meets infrequently when an application for a zoning variance is submitted and they approve or deny the zoning variance request.

The appointments shall begin on January 1, 2020, for the following terms: Planning & Zoning Commission for one, five-year term; Parks and Recreation Board for one, five-year term; and Zoning Board of Adjustment for one, five-year term. Submit completed applications at the office of the City Clerk at 128 W. Lincoln Street. All applicants must be residents of the City and be at least 18 years of age. Applications are subject to the open record laws of the State of Iowa and must be submitted by December 20, 2019. The City of Walcott must make every effort to gender balance our appointed boards and commissions in an effort to ensure diversity and representation of our community.

# NEWS FROM CALVARY

We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.... What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? (Romans 8.28-31, NRSV)

I mentioned on Sunday that this past week the Holy Spirit was bouncing me back and forth from one interesting thinker to the next. When I get caught up in researching a sermon, sometimes I start to see connections in a whole host of seemingly unrelated places, people, and events. It seems to me that God lays a new thing on my heart and then proceeds to reveal a sometimes-confusing trail that ultimately leads to Christ. I will discover an eclectic series of ideas lining up, all seemingly unrelated until they unexpectedly ... fit.

All things work together. This has been a common theme during my time here in Walcott. There's no such thing as a separation between the sacred and secular. Even our most common day to day activities can become an act of faith, if we will just notice God in the middle of it. We just had our annual Charge Conference with our new District Superintendent, and that was a perfect example of how this annual duty and the mundane reporting of statistical information can become an act of worship as the Holy Spirit moves within a group of connected Christians. All things work together for good.

Last month I took a week and went on a retreat with a group of clergy and laity from several states. We had a couple of wonderful speakers, one of whom was a Methodist Elder from Alaska with a delightfully complex mix of ethnic heritage. He was Tlingit, Lakota, Scot, and Norwegian. I am the great-grandson of a Lakota woman born 160 years ago. I know this because when I was 4, I met her. Great Grandmother Sylvester was 104 years old the day I met her, so I remembered the encounter. This meeting began what has become a lifelong fascination with Lakota culture and language. So, I jumped at the chance to go on this retreat to meet this man who had such a rich and interesting cultural background. He taught us a Lakota phrase that I had learned many years ago but was never sure I was pronouncing it right. It is a Lakota cultural mantra of sorts, "Mitakuye Oyasin."

Several years ago one of my parishioners gave me a lovely hand copied poem by someone named Kuan Tao-Sheng. It hung on my wall for years and goes like this:

Take a lump of clay. Wet it, pat it, make a statue of you, and a statue of me. Then shatter them, clatter them. And add some water

and break them and mold them into a statue of you and a statue of me. Then in mine there are bits of you, and in yours there are bits of me. Nothing ever shall keep us apart.

It made me think of that Lakota phrase that keeps popping up in my life, Mitakuye Oyasin means "We are all related." And all these things make me think of the confirmation class that has been meeting in my church for about a year now, and how I want to make sure I read this poem to them, how it and the Lakota phrase illustrate how interconnected we all are before God.

I am awed with how God can cause a Korean poet, a Lakota woman born before the Civil War, six teenagers, a Native American Methodist Elder and a member of a small town Iowa church to lead me to a piece of scripture that so vividly illustrates how all things work together for good for those who love God, how God foreknew, and formed, and called, and justified for God's glory. What then are we to say about these things? Mitakuye Oyasin.


