Summer Youth Recreation Program

The program is limited to 70 participants – sign up early! The six-week summer recreation program, sponsored by the City of Walcott, is scheduled to begin on June 20. The program will be held on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 9 a.m. – Noon, for ages 5 – 14. Participants will be transported from Wescott Park to Camp Abe Lincoln for activities each Monday and Wednesday and field trips are scheduled for Fridays.

Through the City's sponsorship, the registration fee for 54 hours of fun-filled recreation is only \$70 for each child residing in the Walcott community. The Walcott community is defined as residential homes located within Walcott City limits or Fire District #6. Participants residing outside of the Walcott community are required to pay the full cost of \$196.45 per child.

Free Spring Clean-up Day

The City of Walcott will be hosting a Free Spring Clean-up Day for residents of Walcott on May 7, 2022. Dumpsters will be available at the City's compost area, located at the west end of Cedar Lane Drive, from 2 – 5 p.m. Only household waste will be accepted, which includes tires, appliances, and bulky items. NO business, electronic, or hazardous waste will be accepted. The Compost Area will be closed from Friday, May 6 through Monday, May 9, except during the clean-up day hours.

Do you have household hazardous material to dispose of?

Walcott residents may drop off household hazardous material such as paints, pesticides, cleaners, motor oil, oil filters, and antifreeze at no charge at the Household Hazardous Material Facility, located at 5640 Carey Avenue in Davenport.

Directions: Take 53rd Street to Carey Avenue and turn north then drive through the cul-de-sac and into the Scott Area Recycling Center drop-off recycling area. They are

open Monday - Friday from 7:30 a.m.– 4 p.m. and 8 a.m.– Noon on the first Saturday of each month. The facility is open until 5 p.m. on Mondays from May – September. For further information, call (563) 386-9575 or visit their website at www.wastecom.com.

Signs, signs, everywhere a sign

Residents are reminded that signs - rummage sales, garage sales, advertising, etc. – cannot be posted on public or utility right-of-ways (including utility poles), or on the property of another without the property owner's permission. Right-of-way includes the area between the sidewalk and street. Illegal signs removed by city staff can be picked up at City Hall.

Walcott Siren Signals

Fire/EMS Alert - A distinctive wavering high-low tone from the siren located at the Fire Station serves as a backup system, supplementing fire department member's pagers. Residents walking or driving should be prepared to yield to fire department members in their personal cars or emergency vehicles.

Weather Alert - A steady tone for three minutes is used to alert citizens who are outdoors of an imminent hazard and prompt them to go indoors, take shelter, and seek further information. Weather alert sirens will be sounded for:

Tornadoes

- Thunderstorms with winds 70 mph or greater (potential for whole trees to snap or uproot)
- Golf ball sized hail or larger (potential for windows to break)

Weather alert sirens may be sounded multiple times during the threat. There will be no all-clear signal from sirens. The weather alert siren is tested on the first Tuesday of each month at 10 a.m.

The Walcott PTA would like to invite the community members, area businesses and the public to the ribbon cutting for the new playground at Walcott school on May 11 at 2:30 p.m.



Phase 2 was completed in 2018 with the addition of the rope structure called the "spaceball". Phase 3 was completed in 2021 replacing the remaining large playground structure and completing the overall project.


