Don't get penalized

Purchase your pet licenses at City Hall before April 1, 2023, to avoid a delinquent fee. All cats and dogs over six months are required to have an annual city license. The license fee is \$3 per animal and proof of rabies vaccination is required.

Golf cart use on city streets

Limited use of golf carts is permitted in Walcott with the following regulations:


- Annual permits are required: completed application, \$25 fee, copies of Driver's License for all drivers and of current proof of insurance.
- Carts are not allowed on Plainview Road (a.k.a. 60th Ave.), Walcott Rd (a.k.a. 200th Street), or Blue Grass Rd (a.k.a. 70th Ave.)
- Carts shall only be operated from March 1 to Nov. 30, from sunrise to sunset.
- The number of occupants may not exceed the seating capacity recommended by the manufacturer. While operating, any rider must be seated on the seat and no part of the body of any rider will extend beyond the sides of the cart.
- All operators shall observe all state and local traffic regulations.
- No carts shall be operated or parked upon city side walks.
- No cart shall be operated while under the influence of intoxicating liquor, narcotics, or habit-forming drugs.
- No person shall operate a cart in a careless, reckless, or negligent manner endangering the person or property of another or causing injury or damage to the same.

- All carts shall be equipped with a minimum of the following safety features: a slow-moving vehicle sign, a safety flag which the top shall be a minimum of five (5) feet from the ground level, adequate brakes, and a rear-view mirror.
- If the Police Chief approves an application and issues a permit, the operator shall display the permit sticker prominently on the left side rear fender or similar component.
- The permit may be revoked upon finding evidence that the owner or operator has violated the conditions of the permit or has abused the privilege of being a permit holder.

Permits expire on Dec. 31, 2023, regardless of the date of issue. Application forms are available online at www.cityofwalcott.com or at City Hall and should be returned to City Hall when completed.

Park reservations

Spring is here and that means the parks will be filling up fast! Reservation forms for park shelters and gazebos must be completed and remitted to the City Clerk's office with a nonrefundable fee of \$35. If you have questions or would like to reserve a park facility, please contact City Hall at (563) 284-6571 x10. Unreserved facilities will still be available to be enjoyed by the public on a first-come, first-served basis.


The question remains: do you trust Jesus to set the captive free? To proclaim freedom for the prisoner? Do you believe he can? Let's lean into that!


Join Calvary Church for a Seder meal


