Are Your House Numbers Posted?

Property owners are reminded that address numbers must be displayed on the house. The numbers should be:

- At least four inches tall
- A contrasting color to that of their background
- Unobstructed by signs, light fixtures, or plants

House numbers are not only convenient for finding addresses but necessary for emergency responders to locate those in need. When responding to an emergency, minutes matters.

Public Notice

Nomination papers (Affidavit of Candidacy and Nomination Petition) are available at Walcott City Hall, 128 W. Lincoln Street, for any eligible elector in the City of Walcott desiring to become a candidate for the Walcott City election on Nov. 7, 2023. Three council member positions for four-year terms will be on the ballot. The forms are also available at the City's website at www.cityofwalcott.com.

The Affidavit of Candidacy must be notarized, and the Nomination Petition must have at least ten signatures. Nomination papers must be filed with the City Clerk at City Hall during the filing period, which begins on Monday, Aug. 28 and ends on Thursday, Sept. 21 by 5 p.m.


