Snow removal

Residents are reminded that it is the property owner's responsibility to remove snow and ice accumulations promptly from sidewalks. Also, corner lots are required to clear the snow from the access ramps to allow unimpeded passage for pedestrian traffic. Please make arrangements to have your sidewalks maintained at all times and remember that it is illegal to shovel or blow snow onto city streets.

For safety purposes, residents are asked to help keep snow from piling around fire hydrants. This is an important safety measure in case a fire occurs and the Fire Department needs to access the hydrant. Also, if you have mail delivery keep your mailbox cleared so that your mail can be delivered. Thank you for your cooperation!

Snow Emergency Parking:

- A snow emergency will automatically go into effect when snow accumulation reaches two inches. The snow emergency will stay in effect until the streets have been cleared.
- Vehicles are not allowed to be parked on any public street during a snow emergency, except in certain designated angle parking areas. This exception does not include the north side of the 100 block of East Bryant Street.
- Vehicles illegally parked on city streets during a snow emergency will be subject to towing and/or a ticket.

2024 Pet Licenses are now available at City Hall. The annual fee is \$3 per cat or dog and proof of a rabies vaccination is required. License fees become delinquent on April 1.

The Walcott Public Works Department will be picking up live Christmas trees at the curb. Please have trees at the curb by 7 a.m. and do not place bags around the trees.



Quarter Mania

What is Quarter Mania?

A Quartermania is a cross between an auction and a raffle where people

'bid' to win an item. Your bid will be between 1-4 quarters depending on the value of the item up for bid. You may purchase as many paddles (cost of \$5 each) and bid with as many paddles as you have. Example: An item is up for a 3 quarter bid- I purchased 2 paddles- I am bidding with both paddles- I give my collector 6 quarters (3 for each paddle). My paddle number is called- I WIN!

If I did not bid with my paddle it will go face down on the table, if that paddle number is called it is not a win, as it was not used to bid.


