# Dog and cat licenses

It's time to stop by City Hall to obtain a dog or cat license for your pets over the age of six (6) months. License fees are \$3 per animal with a delinquent fee of \$1 added after April 1. Proof of rabies vaccination is required. Residents are reminded it is unlawful for any person to harbor or house on the same premises more than a total of four of the following animals: dogs and cats over the age of six months, unless such animals are in a licensed kennel or pet shop, veterinary clinic, or animal grooming shop.



City Hall is now accepting shelter and gazebo reservations for 2024. Shelter reservations will become effective when the completed reservation form and the nonrefundable fee of \$35 are remitted to the City Clerk's office. Unreserved shelters will still be available to be enjoyed by the general public on a first-come, first-served basis. Please contact the City Clerk's office at (563) 284-6571, ext. 10 for availability. Forms are available at City Hall or online at www.cityofwalcott.com.

Reminder: Please make sure your sidewalks are cleared of snow and ice and remember that it is illegal to shovel or blow snow onto city streets.

# Are your house numbers posted?

Property owners are reminded that address numbers must be displayed on the house. The numbers should be:

- At least four inches tall
- A contrasting color to that of their background
- Unobstructed by signs, light fixtures, or plants House numbers are not only convenient for finding addresses but necessary for emergency responders to locate those in need. When responding to an emergency, minutes matter.

It is also fully air conditioned. The building also features two Vertical Lift Modules from Kardex, that are designed to increase capacity with an enclosed shelf-based storage system. This new distribution center for Iowa80.com will fulfill orders for online trucking accessory orders, as well as ship product to the brick-and-mortar stores operated by Iowa 80 Group, including Iowa 80 Truckstop, Kenly 95 Petro in Kenly, North Carolina, and Joplin 44 Petro, in Joplin, Missouri.

Iowa80.com will host a ribbon cutting to celebrate the grand opening of the new distribution center on Tuesday, Feb. 27, 2024. Join us at 510 Sterling Drive, Suite A, Walcott, Iowa at 1:30 PM for the festivities. Reception to follow.

#### Thoughts From the Belly

As a Master Gardener, I believe in practicing what I preach. In many of my gardening presentations, I am known to say, "The main problems with gardening are that: 1.) Gardeners tend to overcomplicate things. And 2.) Gardeners tend to make things too much work. Yes, I know that snow is on the ground and most gardeners have limited their activities to pouring over garden catalogs and reveling in dreams of warm weather grandeur. On the other hand, many fair-weather gardeners also have indoor plants. These need our attention during the winter. Nothing makes indoor gardening easier than bigger pots. Watering is usually limited to only once per week or less.

Rather than establishing an indoor "intensive care facility for plants" requiring almost daily watering for small pots, I like my containers to be at least 16-inches (or more) in diameter. A side benefit of large pots is that they can make an interior design statement; especially if you have several of them. Of course, with those large pots, weight becomes a problem. Roll-around plant trivets are your salvation - or source of aggravation. They have been both for me.

Over the years, I have bought many plant trivets, knowing that my lovely wife, Cyndia, needed an easy way to shuffle her large Amaryllis pots around. The more trivets that I bought, the more expensive they became. I kept searching for a roll-round trivet that actually rolled. Much to our dismay, they all rolled poorly, in spite of my attempts to lubricate the wheel assemblies. The darn things would often catch on the tile floor and tip over -NOT GOOD!

Years ago, I decided to put all of the machinery in my workshop on wheels - good, 4-inch casters. That has been one of the best decisions I have ever made; albeit, not cheap - but certainly worth it. One day (after a large pot had tipped over) I decided that I could make better plant trivets than I could buy. And that

is exactly what I did. I made the 16" circular base out of highquality ¾" plywood. I sealed the circle with polyurethane and attached high-quality, 2" casters. As an additional precaution, Cyndia always places a 16" plastic tray beneath the pot as well. What a pleasure it is to use these trivets. They actually roll! Now she can easily reposition her pots without ever lifting one.
