

REFUSE & RECYCLING INFORMATION

Garbage Collection: Garbage will be picked every Monday morning. Your totes should be at the curb by 6 a.m. Set the recycling tote at the curb every other Monday morning according to the schedule. Republic Services recognizes six major holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. Garbage collection will run one day late if one of these holidays is observed on a Monday.

Appliances, Electronic Items and Bulky Waste (couches, chairs, etc.): Set by curb. Call City Hall @ 284-6571 x10 for collection. **There is a charge for disposal.** You may take electronic waste to the Scott County E-Waste Facility, 1048 E. 59th St., Davenport, IA, free of charge.

Clean-Up Day: Walcott sponsors a Clean-Up Day every spring and fall. Walcott residents may bring appliances, tires, bulky waste, and other household refuse, free of charge, to the Compost Area on west Cedar Lane Drive. Watch for more information.

Construction/Demolition materials: These materials must be disposed of in a dumpster rented from a private garbage hauler or taken to the Scott County Area Landfill.

Brush Collection: Brush (branches, twigs, etc.) will be collected curbside on Wednesday mornings. Branches must be less than 6" in diameter or 4 feet in length. Tie smaller brush into bundles or place in container.

Leaves: The City offers curbside pickup for leaves in the fall. Leaves only; must be in bags and tied shut. Please contact City Hall for days and dates.

Compost Area: This area is located at the west end of Cedar Lane Drive and is open seasonally. Only residents of Walcott may use this area. Acceptable items: leaves, grass, brush, and garden vegetation ONLY. Do not leave bags.

Christmas Trees: Live Christmas trees will be picked up following the holidays. Watch for notices from City Hall.

Motor oil and automobile batteries: May be brought to the Public Works Building for recycling.

Open Burning is not permitted in Walcott. Recreational fires, burning clean wood only, are allowed in fire pits.

RECYCLING:

All recyclables must be placed in the recycling tote supplied by the City (Republic Services). No sorting is necessary. Place tote at curb every other Monday morning according to the schedule.

Paper Products: Acceptable-Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, corrugated cardboard, cereal boxes, shoeboxes, envelopes, junk mail, paper bags, pop/beer cartons, telephone books. **Unacceptable** – disposable diapers, tube rolls, photographs, greeting cards, dirty pizza boxes, cereal box liners, pet food bags, slick food boxes, coated paper milk and juice cartons, plastic egg cartons, tissue paper, wrapping paper.

Plastic Beverage bottles: with or without lids.

Plastic Containers: On the bottom of plastic containers, you will see a recycling logo with a number inside and letters below. Only plastics labeled 1 - 7 will be accepted. Rinse containers and throw away lids. Labels may be left on. Plastics may be crushed to make more room in the bin. **Unacceptable** - automotive fluid bottles, pesticide containers, plastic bags, prescription pill bottles, Styrofoam.

Glass bottles and jars: Rinsed glass food or beverage containers can be recycled. Labels can be left on. **Unacceptable** - mirrors, window glass, drinking glasses, crystal, Pyrex Ovenware, ceramic, light bulbs, flowerpots.

Clean Metal: Acceptable – Rinsed tin/steel food containers, aluminum foil, pie pans, trays, cans, metal jar lids, aluminum window frames, metal chairs. **Unacceptable** – Paint & aerosol containers, pesticide & chemical containers, iron, steel, batteries, car parts, oil filters.
